This unjust exclusion limits their opportunities to acquire the skills they need to reach their full potential and participate in their communities, perpetuating a cycle of poverty. A high-quality, inclusive education generates real hope for the future of so many children. That's why inclusive environments play a pivotal role in tackling the stigma against people with disabilities.

We provide artificial limbs, eyeglasses, wheelchairs, and other aids to ensure children with disabilities can attend school and get the most out of their lessons.




Inclusion

Home-based learning helps children displaced by war, like Khaled

Khaled is a 4-year-old Syrian refugee living in Jordan. After their home was destroyed by bombing, Khaled and his family's lives were turned upside down. Khaled has a learning disability; access to specialized support is crucial for his development. When he arrived in Jordan, our community-based volunteers identified him and quickly started giving him home-based learning, restoring a sense of normality. Today, we are supporting his parents to enroll him in a local school, where our team will accompany him and ensure he does not fall behind.





Born with a disability affecting her leg, Channa received rehabilitation support from HI. As she grows, our teams in Cambodia fit her with new artificial limbs. Thanks to these prosthetics and ongoing care, Channa can attend school. The fourth grader loves riding her bike and playing with friends. She hopes to become a teacher in the future.

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8-year-old Rosaminah thrives by learning sign language

Known as Minah to her friends, this little girl from Madagascar has defied all challenges. Born Deaf, Minah used to be excluded by the other children in her village because she could not communicate with them. We supported her enrollment at a boarding school for Deaf children, where she has been studying since 2021. She loves learning new sign language gestures and follows the official school curriculum. She goes home to visit her family during the holidays; they can see her confidence grow each time.
